## Start of term update

Dear Parents/Carers,

#### Return to school

#### Parents' section of our website

#### **School Trips**

This year, rather than sharing information about forthcoming school trips with you on an ad-hoc basis throughout the year, we wanted to provide you at the beginning of the year, with a comprehensive summary of all trips that will be offered, so that you and your child can discuss what is on offer and make appropriate decisions about which trips may be suitable. There will always be a few trips that are added to this programme throughout the year, however, the vast majority of what will be offered is contained on the programme. This programme is in the final stages of being approved and you will receive this in an email next week, along with information about extracurricular activities. In what is a volatile financial landscape, with the cost of living rising rapidly, we hope that this enables families to plan accordingly, rather than being asked to respond ad-hoc as trips are made available to pupils throughout the year.

### Recognition of pupil achievement

Last year, almost 40,000 house points were awarded to our pupils, in recognition of their amazing achievements. Congratulations once again to pupils in Stuart House, on winning the House Point Competition last year. The house points will now be reset to zero for all pupils and the competition begins again, with so much for pupils to get themselves involved in, to support their house. ### **Standards Cards**

The vast majority of our pupils consistently meet the expectations that we ask of them, as outlined in the Code of Conduct, which can be found <a href="https://example.com/here.">here.</a>. The reason that so many of our pupils meet these standards as a matter of course, is that any pupils who do not meet these standards are challenged as appropriate.

This year, on their return to school, all pupils will be issued with a 'Standards Card.' If a pupil does not meet a particular standard (for example, their shirt is untucked), they will receive a cross on their card. If a pupil receives a total of five crosses, they will receive a new card and issued with a 30- minute 'Standards Detention.' Pupils must have the card in their possession at all times. If they do not have the card when requested, they will automatically be issued with a 30-minute 'Standards Detention.' All pupils will have this outlined to them by their form tutor on Wednesday (Pupils in Year 7) and Thursday (Pupils in Year 8 to Year 11)
