

Pupil Creativity - Music

Numeracy and Literacy updates

Wordsley pupils have been participating in several numeracy interventions this year and have become very competitive when it comes to the Form Time Numeracy Challenge. There have been over 1200 numeracy points awarded across the school since the start of the academic year.

Pupils have also been improving their numeracy skills weekly by completing 'Numeracy Ninjas' in their Maths lessons. This is a 30-question challenge based on 3 core numeracy elements: mental strategies, times tables and key skills. Pupils have 5 minutes to answer as many questions as possible and achieve a Ninja score, which correlates to a Ninja Belt colour. All pupils have been improving since September and the following have made exceptional progress in their numeracy skills: Will, Rhys, Jamie, Rebecca, Tyler, Ruby, Rafailia, Reegan, Connor,

We have partnered with *'The Brilliant Club'* this year and selected a small group of year 7 & 8 pupils to partake in *'The Scholar Programme'*. The Scholars Programme's aim is to raise the aspirations of pupils and give them access to the most competitive universities in the UK. *'The Scholars Programme'* provides students aged 8-18 from non-selective state schools the opportunity to work with a PhD researcher to experience university-style learning. It helps them to develop the skills, knowledge and confidence to secure a place at a competitive university. As part of this amazing initiative, 14 pupils were invited to attend a taster day at 'St Catherines College University Oxford'. We arrived and were joined by 5 other schools from around the UK. Our pupils got the full university experience starting with a tour of the university. They sampled what it was like to have a lecture in a lecture hall, spoke with and asked questions to current students at the University, ate in the grand dining hall and completed fun and interesting tasks along with the other schools to help better understand what university is like and show them that this is something that they can achieve.

Extra Curricular Activities Duke of Edinburgh -Kinver Expedition

Pupils recently had the opportunity to put their skills to the test from assembling tents to map reading. The DofE program here at Wordsley has brought our young people together to overcome personal and shared challenges. The DofE expedition offers pupils the opportunity to demonstrate their determination and resilience when placed in an unfamiliar environment. Last year's expedition pitted pupils against the elements as they made their journey through torrential wind and rain but this didn't stop them from pulling together in support of each other.

Pupils were able to prove to themselves that by sticking together and trusting in each other's strengths and weaknesses that they could all succeed in addition to completing the final section of their award. The two day expedition involved navigation, cooking, assembling a campsite and even some washing up.

Ski Trip - Ski USA 22

Wordsley pupils were given the amazing opportunity to go on the 'Snow Sports USA 2022' trip. This trip included 5 days of magnificent skiing in the resort of Killington in Vermont known as 'Beast of the East'. Pupils were taught the very basics of skiing and progressed through the daily lessons until they were confidently and happily skiing down from the top of the mountain. Each night pupils went out to a selection of restaurants to enjoy 'authentic American food'. We had the pleasure of watching two D1 high schools go head-to-head in an Ice Hockey match where we - of course supported the home team, who won. We then travelled to the most famous city in the world they named it twice. New York - New York!. On the way we stopped at the Woodbury Common Designer outlet for some window shopping. When we arrived in New York we quickly put our bags in the hotel and went out to explore the Big Apple. We got to visit the Rockefeller Centre and see the famous Christmas tree. We stared at the wonders of Time Square, stopped for a bite to eat at the Hard Rock Cafe, visited the memorial of 9/11, went up the Freedom Tower and Empire State and walked the streets of NYC taking in all of the sights and sounds.
